

Peel Children's Centre Meets 100% of National Accreditation Standards

Moncton – Peel Children's Centre (Peel) is thrilled to announce that it has been awarded a four-year accreditation by the Canadian Centre for Accreditation (CCA), having met 100% of CCA's mandatory and leading practice standards.

In its final report, CCA congratulated Peel for meeting all of the accreditation standards. The report highlighted Peel's innovative approaches to supporting youth in its residential program, including building an on-site hobby farm (complete with goats, donkeys and rabbits), and fostering stronger relationships with the local Indigenous community.

"PCC is a healthy and effective organization that is delivering much needed programs and services to its clients and community," CCA review team noted in the conclusion of their report, adding that the team was impressed by the commitment and passion of Peel's staff and board members.

Accreditation with CCA supports organizations to continually improve the quality and efficiency of the programs and services they provide. The accreditation process included Peel's submission of extensive documentation, followed by a two-day on-site review in Moncton. The accreditation review team also visited Peel's operations in Ontario.

Peel is a registered charity that offers residential treatment programs in Moncton for Maritime youth ages 11 to 19 who are experiencing serious challenges with their emotions, relationships or behaviour.
